**Environment:** Hear from environmental scientists on environmental, rehabilitation and heritage management across a mine's life



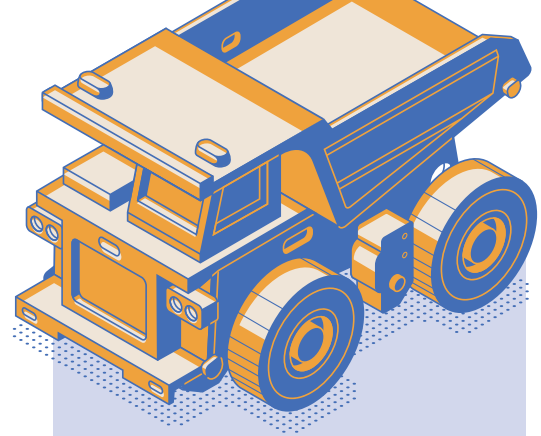
**Technology:** Learn about the digital transformation underway in the mining industry, from AI to mechatronics
