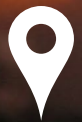

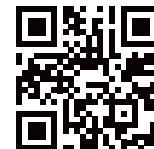

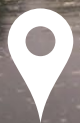

Full Member

A company may become a Full Member of the MCA if its principal business involves exploring, producing or processing minerals, or providing mining services in Australia. The MCA Board may also admit at its discretion organisations it deems suitably associated with these activities.

Producers

A company whose primary business involves mining, extraction or processing minerals and has operations in Australia.

Explorers

A junior or major explorer (based on number of permanent employees) whose primary business is minerals exploration or pre-development.

Associate Member

A company may become an Associate Member of the MCA if it has interests in Australian mining, metallurgical or related industries, are part of the minerals value chain, or provides materials, technology or other services. This could include research and educational institutions or infrastructure providers, such as port, rail and energy operators/owners.

Service providers

A company that provides services to mining operations in Australia, including the supply of goods, labour or mine management services.
